


COUNCIL MEETINGS:

The Town office often receives requests for various landscaping materials, but as a municipality, we can only offer what we require for regular town maintenance. Landscaping materials can be sourced through our local supplier, Brent Doyle of B.A.D.'S Trucking; call 306-629-7778 for more information. Swift Current also hosts landscape suppliers depending on the product that's wanted. We'll give a shout-out to Nijo Yard Supplies Plus!

It's also important to note that a 3-yard maximum of any of the Town supplied materials is allotted per household for a cost, plus delivery at \$20/each load; be it a loader bucket full (holds three yards) or a skid steer bucket full at a time (carries one-yard).

AVAILABLE:

- 1. Gravel (3/4" rock with sand) \$30/yd + delivery
- 2. Crusher dust \$35/yd + delivery
- 3. Dirt (NOT TOPSOIL) from digs, etc. \$25/yd + delivery (not recommended for lawns, gardening, etc.)
- 4. Sand salt \$61.25/yd + delivery



BLOCKING SIDEWALKS

Any plantings bordering a property are growing profusely now & sidewalks are being encroached upon. Cutting back or clearing this growth is required by the homeowner according to Bylaw 2015-03 TO PROVIDE FOR THE PURPOSE OF REGULATING ACTIONS IN PUBLIC PLACES, which states;

- 1.1 Every owner, assessed owner, tenant, or occupier of any land adjoining any street, lane, or public place in the town shall cause all trees, shrubs, and bushes that overhang the sidewalk of the street, lane, or public place to be properly trimmed so as:
 - a. They do not provide obstruction on the sidewalk, street, lane, or public place to pedestrians or vehicles; or
 - b. They do not obstruct the view of pedestrians or vehicles when they approach an intersection.
- 1.2 The Town may give written notice by single Registered mail to the registered owner of a property where trees, shrubs, or bushes overhang the sidewalk of a street, lane, or public place that said trees, shrubs, or bushes require trimming or to be cut back
- 1.3 Should any registered owner not complete the remedial requirements when notified pursuant to 4.6 hereof, the town may undertake the repairs and charge the costs of the remedial repairs to the taxes account of the registered owner.

SEWER LINES & TREE ROOTS

Root intrusion is one of the most destructive elements facing your home's wastewater collection system. Left untreated, tree roots will spread throughout the pipe eventually restricting the flow or even causing a complete blockage and backing up into your home.

How do I know if roots are the problem?

If you've been experiencing sewer backup, and a sewer service or plumber has seen to clearing it, a request can be made for the Town to implement the sewer camera to view the line. The fee attached to this service is \$150.00.

Upon viewing the sewer line, the Town can diagnose whether tree roots are the issue, or not, & prescribe a treatment depending on the extent of the problem.

To keep roots at bay, a root killer specifically designed for this purpose should be used to mitigate further root problems. There are many root killers available on the market, but it's important that this is only applied after the roots have been cut by the sewer service/plumber. Root Killer is an extremely effective way of controlling and preventing the growth of roots in your sewer line or septic, but it cannot repair pipes or remove any other type of blockage.
