HOW TO DETERMINE A LEAKING TOILET

We've installed a number of BADGER® meters to date & are eager to keep installations going. It's interesting to note that from those that have been installed, the program has detected sizeable leaks which has enabled us to impart the information to affected ratepayers.

One of the more obvious causes of problematic leaks are toilets. Here are a few suggestions to help the homeowner determine if one is leaking.

Identifying a leaking toilet should be done as soon as you suspect a leak, in the interest of saving water and money. There are some simple ways in which you can test a toilet for leaks.

One way is to open the toilet tank, drop in a dye tablet or some food colouring, and wait 15-20 mins. When you return, look in the toilet bowl, no the tank. If you see coloured water, then there's a leak. If you don't have food colouring or dye, make

sure, the water level isn't above the overflow pipe in the tank.

If it is, then the fill valve may be the problem. If you see water trickling down the inside of the toilet bowl when it hasn't been flushed, this is a sign of a leak. If an unused toilet is making lots of noise (a running noise), then there's a leak. If you can jiggle the handle and make the running stop then you probably need to adjust the flapper valve or the chain connecting the flush handle to the flapper valve.

If you think the toilet might be leaking, but none of the suggested tests have work, there is one last way to determine the problem. Before going to bed, shut the water off to the toilet. In the morning check the water level in the tank. If there is only an inch of water left at the bottom of the tank, then one or more of your tank parts is ineffective and is allowing the leak.

I accidentally swallowed Scrabble tiles.

My next trip to the toilet could spell disaster.
